What are the Asian Games?

The Asian Games are a multi-sport event organised by the Olympic Council of Asia (OCA), held once every four years in principle, involving Asian countries and regions.



History of the Asian Games

In 1951, shortly after the end of World War II, the first Asian Games were held in New Delhi, India with the participation of 11 countries.

A desire emerged that, through the event, the bonds among Asian countries torn apart by the war could be restored through sports, thereby contributing to permanent peace in Asia. Since then, the Asian Games have become a major event, contributing to international peace by cultivating friendships through sports and acknowledging diversity.

In Japan, the third Asian Games were held in Tokyo in 1958, and the 12th in Hiroshima in 1994. In 2026, the 20th Games will be held in Nagoya, Aichi, thus returning to Japan for the first time in 32 years.

Games Emblem



The liveliness of sports is depicted through free-flowing curves. The centre line, emerging from a brightly shining sun (the symbol of the OCA) and the purple, gold and green, inspires the image of people coming together as one, and going forward to the future.

The emblem colours are fitting of Aichi and Nagoya, with the purple of the rabbit-ear iris, the prefectural flower of Aichi, the gold of the kinshachi, golden tiger-fish roof ornaments which are a symbol of Nagoya Castle, and the green of environmental consciousness, fostered through EXPO 2005 Aichi, COP 10 and the UNESCO World Conference on ESD.

And looking closely, one can see Asia and Aichi's "A" in the purple curve and centre line, and Nagoya's "N" in the purple and gold curves.

Games Slogan

IMAGINE ONE ASIA

ここで、ひとつに。

Sports have a power to bring people together beyond the barriers of language, culture and nationality.

The slogan represents a wish for Aichi-Nagoya 2026 to make the most of this power, and for each of us living in diverse society to imagine their own ONE ASIA, so that our bonds can be strengthened, bringing us forward to a bright future.

Also represented is a hope for the athletes, volunteers, spectators, and others taking part in the Games to come together as one through sharing various time, space, experiences and awe.

Games Core Graphics



The Core Graphics is the visual that symbolizes the 20th Asian Games and serves as the foundation for unique designs used in the decoration of competition venues and cityscapes.

Its basic form is a layered composition that combines the Arc “Glory Bridge,” derived from the Games Emblem, with “Icons” that express brand elements characteristic of Aichi and Nagoya.

Games Mascot



The mascot of the 20th Asian Games, “HONOHON,” was born from the fiery passion that dwells in the hearts of athletes, becoming one with Shachihoko, the guardian deity of Aichi-Nagoya.

The name “HONOHON” is derived from the word “Honoho,” which is said to be the origin of the Japanese word meaning “flame.” This word comes from the image of fire rising high and burning brightly, resembling the shape of a rice ear (“ho” in Japanese). To make the name sound more friendly, we named it “HONOHON.”

Sport Pictograms



The sport pictograms for the 20th Asian Games were developed with simplicity as a fundamental principle to fulfill their core function. At the same time, the design incorporates the arc motif "Glory Bridge" from the Games emblem as a design concept, expressing the dynamism and strength of athletes, as well as the speed and "movement" of sports. Furthermore, by connecting the Glory Bridge with the silhouettes of the athletes, the design expresses a spirit of "harmony" and "unity," resonating with the Games slogan, "IMAGINE ONE ASIA ここで、ひとつに。" Based on these ideas, the sport pictograms for this Games were developed under the concept "Resonate as One 共に響きあう," aiming to provide a consistent and unified visual image when viewed as a whole, while also enhancing the distinctiveness of each individual design.

1. the Act on Prohibition of Unauthorized Ticket Resale

The Act on Ensuring Proper Distribution of Admission Tickets through the Prohibition of Unauthorized Resale of Specified Event Admission Tickets (commonly referred to as the Act on Prohibition of Unauthorized Ticket Resale) came into effect on 14 June 2019. Any unauthorized resale constitutes a serious criminal offence, which may result in fines or other criminal penalties.

The Organising Committee will conduct monitoring and investigations regarding the use of tickets and will take strict action against any individuals or organisations found to be in violation.

We kindly ask for your cooperation in handling and managing tickets with due care and in strict compliance with the prescribed rules.

2. Ticket Type

(1) Child Ticket

This is a discounted ticket for children under 15 years old as of the session date. Please note that age verification may be required at entry.

Child pricing is available only for the lowest seating category in each sport discipline. This ticket offers good value for families and groups attending together.

When children under 15 spectate together with companions aged 15 or over, the spectators aged 15 or over must purchase a General Ticket in the lowest seating category (e.g., for Basketball, spectators aged 15 or over must purchase a General Ticket of Category B, while the children aged 3–14 may purchase a Child Ticket).

*The lowest seat category is General Admission.

Children under 3 years old (not yet in school) may enter free of charge if seated on a guardian's lap. (A ticket is required if a seat is needed.)

If you wish to purchase seats other than the lowest seating category, children under 15 must purchase tickets at the standard price.

2. Ticket Type

(2) Disability Discount Ticket

A discounted ticket is available for persons with a disability certificate and any number of accompanying persons. The disability certificate will be checked at the time of entry.

The discount is available only for the lowest seating category for each sport.

If you wish to purchase seats other than the lowest price category, please purchase a standard price ticket.

The lowest seating category is general admission (with some exceptions).

All accompanying persons must enter and exit the venue together with the ticket holder with a disability certificate.

Separate entry or exit is not permitted. There seating category, including higher categories, please purchase a ticket at the regular price, even if you hold a disability certificate.

(3) Wheelchair Ticket

This ticket allows guests using a wheelchair and one accompanying person to attend the event together. (One accompanying person only.)

Wheelchair seating is available for all sessions.

The wheelchair user will be charged the Wheelchair Ticket price, and one accompanying person may attend free of charge. The accompanying seat will be located adjacent to the wheelchair space.

The accompanying person must enter and exit the venue together with the wheelchair user at the same time. Separate entry or exit is not permitted.

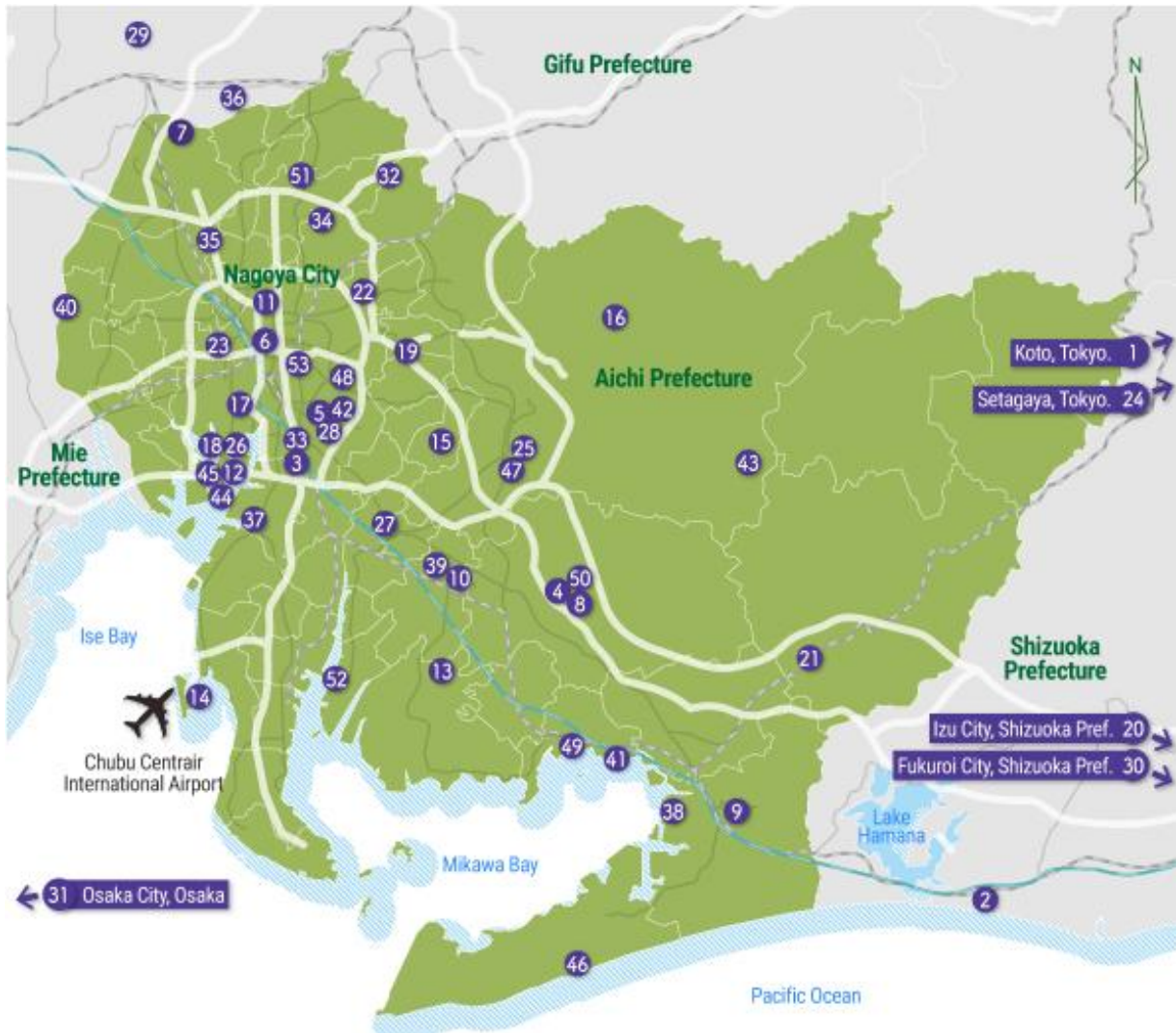
3. Advance Registration of Accompanying Persons and Identity Verification

For certain sessions, including the Opening Ceremony and the Closing Ceremony, ticket purchasers are required to submit in advance the details of all attendees, including accompanying persons. Identity verification will be conducted at the time of entry, and admission may be denied if an attendee's identity cannot be confirmed. Thank you for your understanding.

If a violation of the above rules is identified, the Organising Committee may invalidate any tickets already sold and revoke the right to purchase tickets.

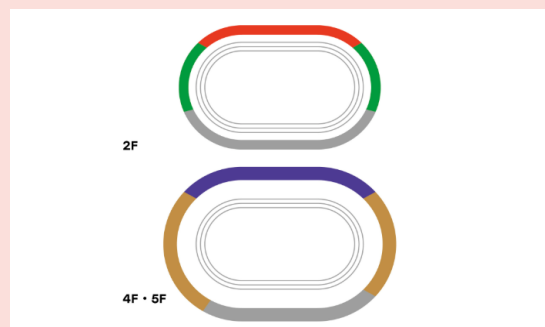
While fully expressing the unique character of Aichi and Nagoya, we will deliver moments that unite the heartbeat and the spirit of both athletes and spectators across Asia.

When attending the opening or closing ceremonies, prior registration of visitor information is required. Upon admission, identity verification will be conducted based on the registered visitor information. For details, please note the following:

■ Identity Verification at Entry

At the designated location, please show your admission ticket and valid identification document(s) to the staff. Acceptable identification document(s) is/are either of the following:

- ONE government-issued photo ID (e.g., Driver's License, My Number Card, Passport, Disability Certificate, Student ID Card, Residence Card, etc.)
- TWO government-issued IDs without photo (e.g., Health Insurance Card, Pension Handbook, Pension Certificate, Copy of Residence Certificate, etc.)

※Please note that if you cannot show the above identification document(s) or cannot verify your identity, you will not be allowed to enter the event venue.

■ How to Register Visitor Information

■ Notes for the Event Day

- During performances, admission will be restricted, and movement within the venue will be limited at certain times for production purposes.
- Please make sure to arrive by the specified time to be announced on the official ticket information website, for identity verification procedures.

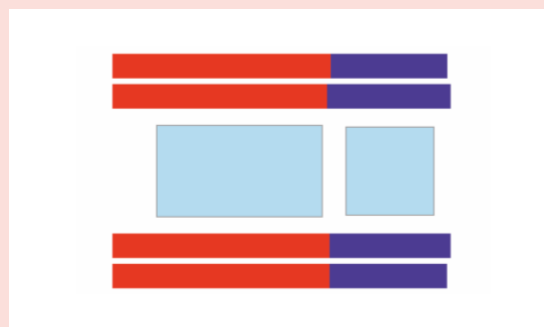

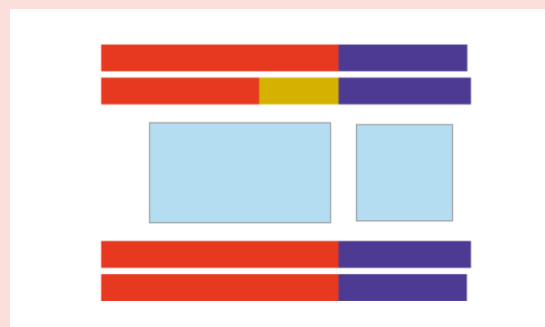

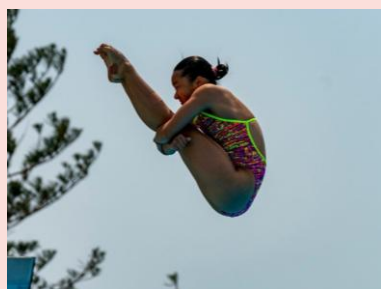
Aquatics (Diving)

The ultimate leap etched on water, where challenge and beauty merge.

The highlight of diving is its “fleeting beauty,” which unfolds in less than two seconds from the start of the performance.

Judging begins with the starting position and evaluates elements such as the takeoff, aerial movements, and water entry, with deductions from a maximum score of 10.

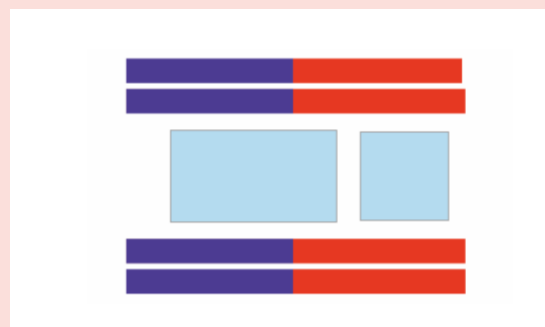
One key criterion for water entry is achieving a dive with absolutely no splash—only bubbles visible on the surface—which earns a very high score. So keep an eye out for this when you watch!

Cricket (T20)

Played Over 360 Degrees. Asia Fires Up with a Game Between Bat & Ball.

Cricket is a ball game played over multiple innings between two teams of 11 players each. In each innings, one team bats, attempting to score runs, while the other team bowls and fields the ball, attempting to restrict the scoring and dismiss the batters. During the batting innings, a batter can hit the ball in any direction using a wooden bat, and runs between the wickets with another batter to score runs before the ball returns. On the fielding side, bowlers bowl the ball trying to end the innings by getting the batters out. The winner is the team that scores the most runs. Match formats include Test matches, One Day matches, and T20 matches. T20 is an aggressive and fast format of the game in which each team bats for one inning of 20 overs, facing 120 balls.

This is the format that will be adopted for the Aichi-Nagoya 2026 Games, and its dynamic batting and strategic nature are its attractions.

Women's Artistic Gymnastics has four apparatus: Vault, Uneven Bars, Balance Beam, and Floor Exercise. Gymnasts are awarded a D score for difficulty and an E score for execution.

The difficulty score is based on the performed moves, earning between 0.1 and 1.0 points per move. The top eight moves are counted for women, and top 10 for men, to give them their score associated with the vault skill element.

For their E score, every gymnast starts with the perfect 10.0 score, with points deducted for any mistakes.

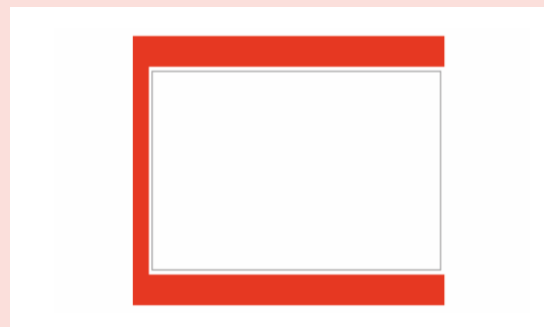
Kabaddi originated in BC. The technique of surrounding prey and fighting without weapons, as well as a way to defend against animal attacks, eventually evolved into the sport that became kabaddi. Kabaddi is a unique game with unique rules that combine tag and dodgeball. Each team consists of seven players. One raider (attacker) enters the opponent's court, touches the body of the ante (defensive) player, and then returns to their own side to eliminate the player who touched them. Each player receives a point. While attacking, players must keep saying "kabaddi" without taking a breath. If they stop breathing, say something other than "kabaddi," or fail to return to their own side, they are eliminated and the defending team scores. Taolu is a judged competition focusing on the precision and execution of movements, featuring both unarmed events and weapon events using swords, broadswords, cudgels, spears, and other weapons. Sanda is a combat sport where competitors fight to determine victory or defeat, taking place on a platform called a "leitai".

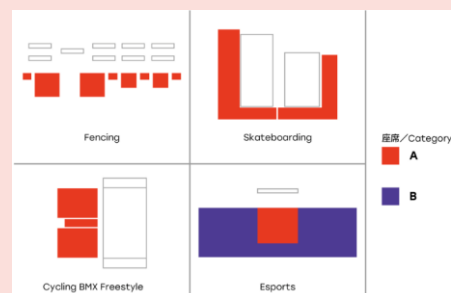

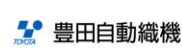
